EDUCATION




The Potter's Palace Christian School held its Parent Association meeting at the beginning of the term. The meeting provided a platform to formally open the term, review academic expectations and outline planned activities. Matters relating to academic performance and shared responsibility for the holistic development of the children were also addressed.

For this month, the Guidance and Counseling Session covered 'Sexual Harassment'. The sessions covered age-appropriate discussions on understanding personal boundaries, identifying inappropriate behavior, reporting mechanisms and the importance of speaking up.

A Bible quiz competition was also organized for the students of our school with a focus on the Book of Habakkuk. Some of our Senior High School students returned home for vacation at the end of the academic period.

HEALTHCARE



All our children remained in good health during the month.

One child developed a leg infection and was admitted to the hospital for treatment and has been discharged.

Routine sickle cell clinic attendance and child welfare clinic visits were also carried out as scheduled.



STAFFING



During the month, a board meeting was successfully held to review operations, discuss strategic matters and provide guidance for upcoming initiatives for the year.

We received two National Service Personnel to support our activities. One new caregiver was also employed to strengthen daily care of the children. In addition, one volunteer joined the team to assist with the work we do.

Our headteacher participated in an important meeting with our district's education directorate. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss key issues concerning private school administration, collaboration with the directorate and other relevant matters to improving educational outcome within the district.

Another staff also attended a stakeholder's engagement meeting with residential homes which was organised by Both Ends Believe In and Family Based Care Alliance.

The home received three new children through the Department of Social Welfare and Community Development. Two of the same children were successfully discharged and reintegrated into their family.

Partners from 633 Foundation and the Engineer in charge of our Girls' Dormitory Project visited to inspect ongoing project works and provided technical guidance and corrections where necessary.

Baker's Galaxy celebrated the birthdays of children born in the month of February, bringing joy and creating memorable moments with the children.

The organization also held its monthly Anointing and Thanksgiving Service to thank God for His manifold blessings. The service was combined with a celebration of staff and children whose birthdays fell in February.

One of our key donors, Mr. and Mrs. Afari, provided gifts and support to some of the women in the Dodowa Widows group connected to the organization during his birthday celebration on our premises.

When completed, it will provide a safe and supportive space for our girls who are currently sleeping in a structure meant to serve as a clinic for the home. It will also serve as a shelter for women who go through different forms of abuse.

The next and very vital phase is the decking and we remain hopeful and committed as we continue this important work.


