EDUCATION

Restored Life Group & Soul Care Ministries donated school bags to the children in the home.

This month, five of our beneficiaries successfully completed their tertiary education, while nine others complete Senior High school.

We also had ten new Senior High School students, reporting to their various schools. We remain grateful to all our donors and well-wishers for making education a reality for these young ones especially. Mama Mary Gyawaa, Mr. & Mrs. Owusu- Nhyira.

The Potter's Palace Christian School held a Parents' Association meeting. The meeting addressed academic performance, discipline and the upcoming term's expectations. It was a productive gathering, and we are thankful to all parents who made time to attend and contribute.

As part of our continuous Guidance and Counselling Sessions, discussions were held on the effects, challenges and management of development on the Individual, aimed at promoting positive values and holistic growth among our children.







STAFFING

In line with our commitment to continuous staff capacity building, one of our teachers participated in a Phonics Workshop for Teaching Facilitators.

Another attended a two - day cluster-based capacity building training workshop for Creative Arts and Design.

These trainings have enhanced their classroom delivery and creativity in engaging our pupils.





HEALTH

In the area of health, two of our children attended their regular check up at the Sickle Cell Clinic. However, one of them was admitted due to sickle cell crisis.

Three of them also went to the eye clinic for a checkup, they were given medications. We are grateful to Dr. Nicholas and his team at the Momentum Eye Clinic for their support.

Five others received treatment from the hospital for malaria and cold infections.

Additionally, we supported three malnourished babies at the Shai- Osudoku Hospital. Two of them, who are twins, are still on admission and continue to receive our support. The third child, a baby boy who suffered from low blood sugar and had to be resuscitated; has been discharged. We provided his special nutrition, settled his hospital bill and are offering ongoing aftercare.

We are thankful for the support we receive to aid the recovery of these children.







We held our regular Anointing and Thanksgiving Service, to worship, and give thanks to God for His continued provision. Special prayers were offered for our donors. We also celebrated the birthdays of staff and children born in the month of October.

We are also grateful to Panbros Salt Industries Limited for their generous donation to 55 widows in celebration of their CEO's birthday; a gesture that brought smiles and encouragement to many homes.

One of our key goals remains populating the Kingdom of God; we used the same opportunity to spread the Gospel to by teaching them about the love of Christ for them.

At the heart of our mission is the belief that every child deserves the warmth and stability of a family. In line with this, we successfully reintegrated two of our children with his family.

Together with the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Nu Lambda Sigma Chapter, we organized a training session for twenty women in the community on fruits preparation as an avenue for small-scale entrepreneurship. The session also encouraged women to preparing nutritious meals for children using locally available ingredients, as an alternative to sugar-based foods. They also went home with some gift items from The Potter's Village.

Flourishing Baby

When we first met Papi (*not his real name*), he was only two weeks old, beautiful and quiet. Before he arrived, he was fragile, malnourished and fighting for life. His mother, who faces the challenge of being deaf, mute and mentally unstable, could not nurse him, leaving him without the sustenance every newborn needs.

For weeks, Papi remained in the hospital, his tiny frame weakened but his spirit unbroken. The doctors and nurses did all they could and when it was time for the next chapter of his journey, The Potter's Village opened its doors to him; a new home filled with love and care.

At The Potter's Village, every feed, every cuddle, every eye contact, every hug, and every song has become part of his healing. Our caregivers have poured love and dedication into his growth, ensuring that he not only survives but blossoms. Day by day, he reminds us that love truly restores what life once tried to take away.

Today, at five months old, Papi is flourishing. His cheeks are full, his laughter fills the room, and his eyes shine with the promise of a beautiful future. Every smile he gives is a reminder of why we do what we do; to restore hope, to nurture life and to give every child the chance to grow in love.

When completed, it will provide a safe and supportive space for our girls who are currently sleeping in a structure meant to serve as a clinic for the home. It will also serve as a shelter for women who go through different forms of abuse.

By the grace of God and with the generous support of our donors, we have successfully completed the foundational and pillar reinforcements. The block work to the lintel level is also completed.


The next and very vital phase is the decking and we remain hopeful and committed as we continue this important work.
